S1 and S2 Welcome Event 24th August 2002

- 12 responses (6 x S1 and 6 x S2)
- Rating of information shared prior to the event. 4.58/5.00
- 100% of parents/carers said they received a warm welcome
- 92% of parents/carers said they had a better understanding of the school values and ethos following the event
- Overall, the information shared was rated at 4.58/5.00
- The most useful information was:

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- o Support available for children/on-line and in school
- o Curricular updates
- Meeting the staff/staff enthusiasm
- Raising Teen with Confidence is running again
- o iPad update
- How parents can be involved e.g. RRSA
- How the event could be improved:
 - Information on homework
 - Add links for Maths and English in the handout
 - $\circ~$ A tour of the school
 - Opportunity to interact with other parents/discussions groups
 - Concerns around literacy and reading, might have been better to combine SfL and Literacy presentation
 - o More notice about the date

- Comments on future improvements:
 - o It was too hot
 - o Can parents access SCHOLAR
 - \circ $\,$ Too many people in some sessions and we had to stand in the corridor
 - Could this be prior to course choice?
 - \circ $\;$ It would be helpful to keep staff to time as some started sessions early
 - o No Drama information
 - Would be good if all subjects could email out prior to key assessments
 - Bigger rooms for Maths and English
 - Could there be sessions for individual subjects rather than faculty based

Our next steps going forward:

- \circ $\;$ Provide more slots for busier sessions like English and Maths
- In English/Maths, provide discreet sessions for N5 and Higher
- English and Maths to be in larger spaces
- Look at how we communicate dates/times of formal class assessments consistently across faculties



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
